**INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY**

The UnionBank Philippine Peso Fixed Income Portfolio is a peso-denominated bond fund designed to provide investors higher returns than traditional fixed-income savings products.

**CLIENT SUITABILITY**

A client profiling process should be performed prior to participating in the Fund to guide the prospective investor if the Fund is suited to his/her investment objectives and risk tolerance. Clients are advised to read the Declaration of Trust/Plan Rules of the Fund, which may be obtained from the Trustee, before deciding to invest.

- The UnionBank Philippine Peso Fixed Income Portfolio is suitable only for investors who:

Some of the key risks associated with this Fund are listed below:

- **Interest Rate Risk:** This is the possibility to experience losses due to changes in interest rates. The purchase and sale of a debt instrument may result in profit or loss because the value of a debt instrument changes inversely with prevailing interest rates.

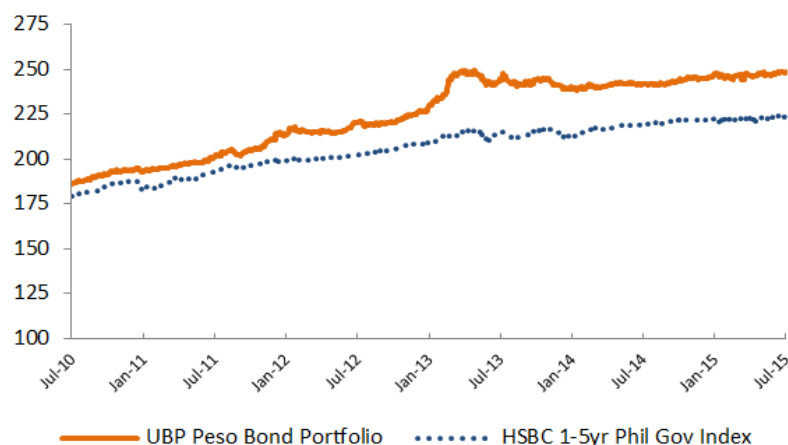

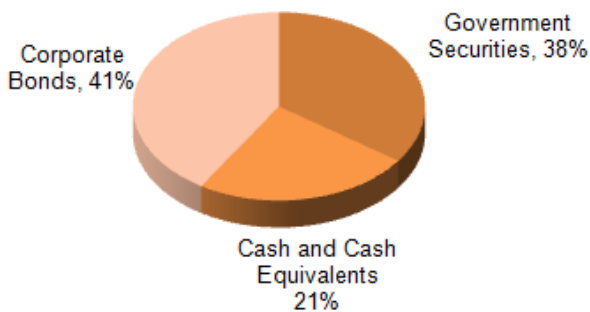

The Fund has no outstanding investment in the issuances of companies related to UnionBank of the Philippines.

**OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY**

BSP's Felipe Medalla said: "The low inflation rate creates space for the BSP to reduce the reserve requirement" and "We have a very high reserve requirement, which should go down." Local bond yields tightened tracking UST movements and some players are already buying the front end in anticipation of a lower July CPI and the possible RRR cut from the BSP. Activity was relatively muted and generally focused on the 20-17(16yr) and 10-59 (9yr). The longer bonds traded at the range of 4.10%-4.15% while the latter closed at 3.55%- 3.59% pct. Move downwards was gradual as players took advantage of lower yields to take profit. Meanwhile, the BTR successfully issued Php25.0B of the 5-72 at 3.089%, within market range of 3.050% to 3.100%. BTR also stated that they are looking to do a PHP bond swap in September before the Fed lift off.
