**INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY**

The UnionBank Dollar Bond Portfolio is a US Dollar-denominated bond fund designed to provide investors with higher returns than traditional fixed-income savings products. Earnings volatility is kept at moderate levels, through disciplined investment selection and tenor diversification.

**CLIENT SUITABILITY**

A client profiling process should be performed prior to participating in the Fund to guide the prospective investor if the Fund is suited to his/her investment objectives and risk tolerance. Clients are advised to read the Declaration of Trust/Plan Rules of the Fund, which may be obtained from the Trustee, before deciding to invest.

- The UnionBank Dollar Bond Portfolio is suitable only for investors who:

Some of the key risks associated with this Fund are listed below:

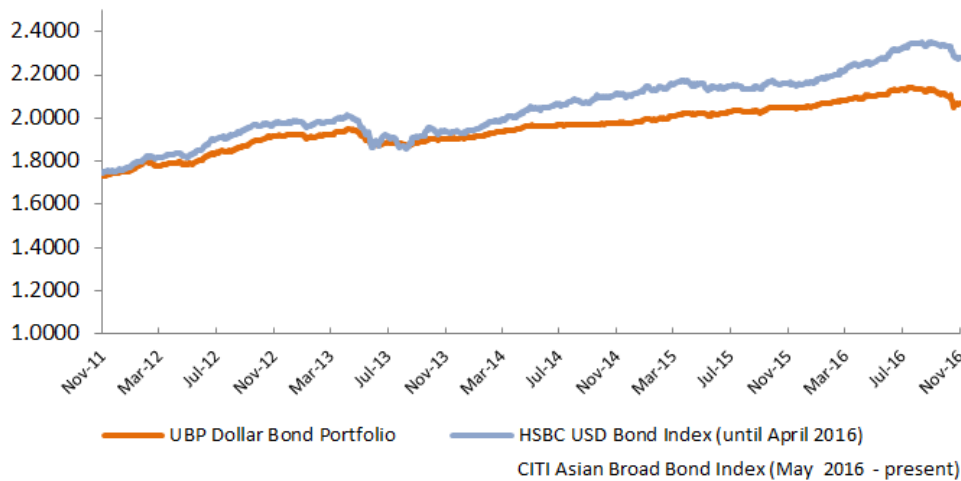

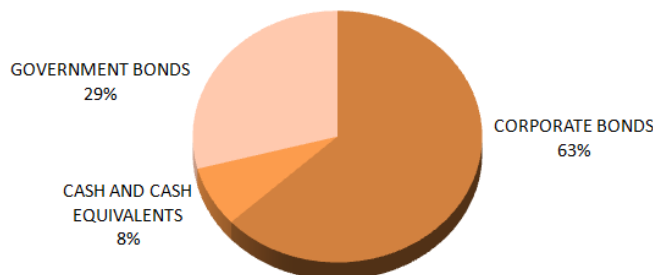

**RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS**

The fund has time deposits with UnionBank of the Philippines amounting to USD 282,653.13. This investment outlet was approved by the Trust Committee. Likewise, all related parties transactions are conducted on an arm's length basis.

**OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY**

Donald Trump's upset victory in the US elections threatened to direct the global markets to uncharted territories. The president elect's rhetoric on protectionism and higher fiscal spending raised the spectre of higher real rates and reduced capital flows. Emerging markets in general took a beating as the dollar strengthened and benchmark US treasuries rose to its fastest pace since the taper tantrum in 2013. Vulnerability of the emerging markets stemmed from trade links to the US, total leverage, monetary space and dependency on external financing.

Philippine sovereign yields rose 30-50bps across the curve with the 25 year bond being hit the most. ROP prices on the average plummeted to negative territory on a year to date basis. With the drop in prices, the market has evidently priced in a 25 basis point hike from the Fed this coming meeting on December 14. Market players remain defensive and vigilant for now on how Trump's fiscal policy direction will impact the pace of tightening of the Fed throughout 2017 with a bias of both nominal and real yields at the upside risks.
