INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

The UnionBank Dollar Bond Portfolio is a US Dollar-denominated bond fund designed to provide investors with higher returns than traditional fixed-income savings products. Earnings volatility is kept at moderate levels, through disciplined investment selection and tenor diversification.

CLIENT SUITABILITY

A client profiling process should be performed prior to participating in the Fund to guide the prospective investor if the Fund is suited to his/her investment objectives and risk tolerance. Clients are advised to read the Declaration of Trust/Plan Rules of the Fund, which may be obtained from the Trustee, before deciding to invest.

- The UnionBank Dollar Bond Portfolio is suitable only for investors who:
 - Are individuals of legal age and corporations with a medium to long-term investment horizon
 - Have a moderately conservative risk profile

Some of the key risks associated with this Fund are listed below:

- **Interest Rate Risk:** This is the possibility to experience losses due to changes in interest rates. The purchase and sale of a debt instrument may result in profit or loss because the value of a debt instrument changes inversely with prevailing interest rates.
- **Market/Price Risk:** This is the possibility to experience losses due to adverse changes in market prices of securities. It is the exposure to the uncertain market value of a portfolio due to price fluctuations.

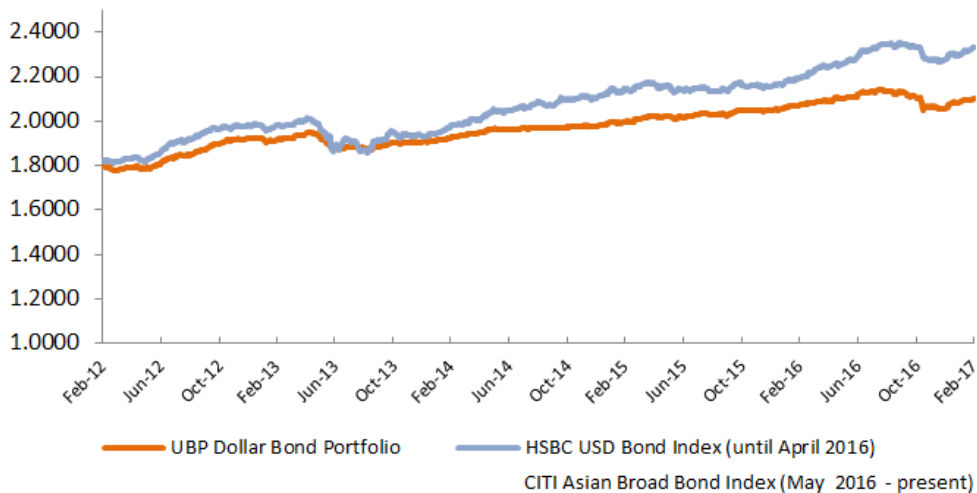

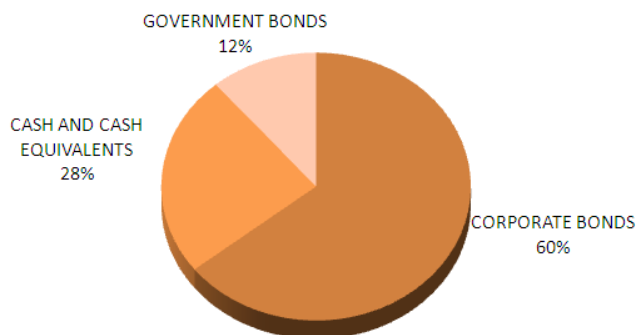

RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The fund has time deposits with UnionBank of the Philippines amounting to USD 1.00 Mn. This investment outlet was approved by the Trust Committee. Likewise, all related parties transactions are conducted on an arm's length basis.

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

With major central banks holding their key rates unchanged with a general tone of no more stimulus to come, market players focused mostly on more details of President Trump's policies and comments from the FED officials. The most awaited President Trump's speech at the congress disappointed most due to the lack of defining details on the tax reforms however still managed to boost optimism with his pro growth rhetoric. Meanwhile, FED members mostly hinted hawkish comments. Fed Chair Janet Yellen was believed by the markets to have cemented a hike decision on its March 15 meeting. With US data coming out as somehow supportive of a view of sustained economic activity within FED's goals, market has been increasingly pricing in a 25 basis point hike.

Emerging market credit started strong during the first weeks of February as prices tightened due to movements from real money accounts. However as US treasury yields moved up, ROP prices grinded lower as soon fed members spoke about the high probability of a march 15 rate hike. ROP yield curve slightly steepened as we end the month with players mostly on the cautious and defensive side.
