INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

The UnionBank Dollar Bond Portfolio is a US Dollar-denominated bond fund designed to provide investors with higher returns than traditional fixed-income savings products. Earnings volatility is kept at moderate levels, through disciplined investment selection and tenor diversification.

CLIENT SUITABILITY

Some of the key risks associated with this Fund are listed below:





RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The fund has time deposits with UnionBank of the Philippines amounting to USD 200,443.66. This investment outlet was approved by the Trust Committee. Likewise, all related parties transactions are conducted on an arm's length basis.

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

U.S. jobs surged in May, adding 223,000 jobs while unemployment rate dropped to 3.8% (18-year low, since April 2000), manifesting improving labor market conditions. Personal consumption expenditure (PCE) also rose 0.60% month-on-month and 1.80% year-on-year.

At its May 1-2 FOMC meeting, the FED kept key interest rates unchanged at 1.5%-1.75%, in-line with market expectations. Minutes stated the upbeat assessment of the economy and a less hawkish tone on the pace of the normalization of interest rates. The FED seemed comfortable with inflation temporarily hitting above its 2% in the medium term. A 25bps hike this June 12-13 meeting is at near certainty and is being priced in by the market.

During the month, US Treasury 10-year yield shot as high as 3.128% when the FED stated that inflation is nearing their 2% target. 10-year yield then retreated below 3% on the back of the risk-off sentiment after the deadlock in Italian politics, tariff imposition and the release of FOMC FED minutes indicating another interest rate increase. The US bond yield curve remained flat with the 10-year spread of from the 7 year of around 10bps.

On the local front, ROPs continued to track movement of USTs. ROPs performed better than INDONs on the long-end of the curve with ROP 42s 3.4 basis points tighter month-on-month while INDON 48 were down 4 basis points. Global developments sparked a sell-off in our local currency. USDPHP weakened further from 51.965 (month end April) to 52.689 end of month.
