INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

The UnionBank Peso Balanced Portfolio is a peso-denominated balanced fund that provides investors access to a diversified set of investment instruments in both equities and fixed-income markets. The balanced approach to asset allocation is designed to provide income and potential growth from fixed-income and equity investments but with less volatility than a portfolio invested entirely in equities.

CLIENT SUITABILITY

A client profiling process should be performed prior to participating in the Fund to guide the prospective investor if the Fund is suited to his/her investment objectives and risk tolerance. Clients are advised to read the Declaration of Trust/Plan Rules of the Fund, which may be obtained from the Trustee, before deciding to invest.

- The UnionBank Peso Balanced Portfolio is suitable only for investors who:
 - Are individuals of legal age and corporations with a medium to long-term investment horizon
 - Have a moderately aggressive risk profile

Some of the key risks associated with this Fund are listed below:

- **Interest Rate Risk:** This is the possibility to experience losses due to changes in interest rates. The purchase and sale of a debt instrument may result in profit or loss because the value of a debt instrument changes inversely with prevailing interest rates.
- **Market/Price Risk:** This is the possibility to experience losses due to adverse changes in market prices of securities. It is the exposure to the uncertain market value of a portfolio due to price fluctuations.

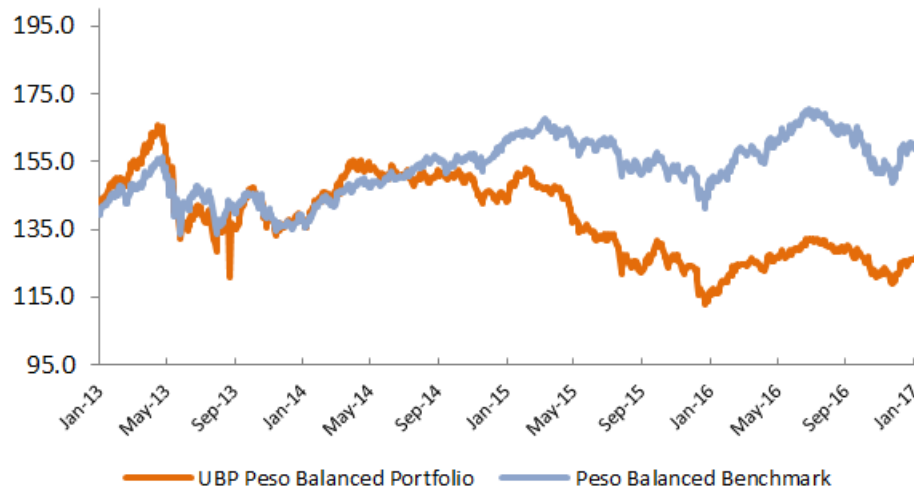

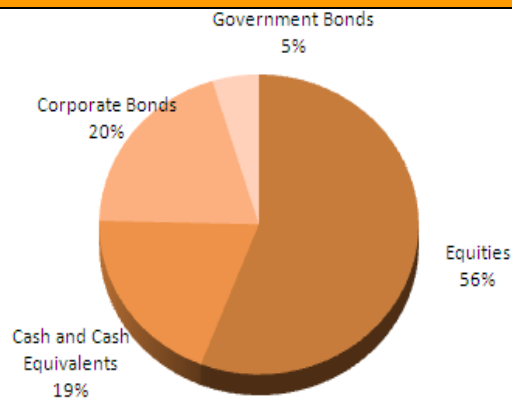

RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The fund has bond investments with Aboitiz Equity Ventures, equity investments with Aboitiz Power and time deposits with City Savings Bank amounting to Php 10.27 Mn, Php 3.38 Mn and Php 20.74 Mn respectively. These investment outlets were approved by the Trust Committee. Likewise, all related parties transactions are conducted on an arm's length basis.

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

Equity. The index saw strong inflows in the first week of the year to start off 2017 with a steep climb, closing 5.7% higher for January. This may primarily be due to flows as January also marked the first month of net inflows, albeit at just US\$ 5.8 M. Large cap names, particularly those which saw a weak 2016, were the biggest beneficiaries with many fund managers looking to catch up with the market's sudden rise.

We may need to observe if foreign flows are maintained given that outflows look to be on the way without any catalysts driving the market higher. A catalyst may be the passage of the first tax reform package that was submitted though this is expected to be met with opposition. We have rotated our holdings and plan to remain nimble with the ability to deploy into or take profit on liquid names.

Fixed Income. Philippine Headline inflation rose in January to 2.7%. CPI print was a tad lower than market expectations driven by supply side pressures as food, housing, utilities and transport.

The Central bank kept its benchmark rates on hold at 3% -3.5% as widely expected while revising its inflation expectations to 3.5% from 3.3% (2017) and to 3.1% from 3.0%(2018). Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas is confident that inflation will remain between their comfort range of 2-4% this year even though upside risks arise. Policymakers said “trends in domestic economic activity show sustained firmness, supported by solid private household consumption and investment, buoyant business and consumer sentiment, and adequate credit and domestic liquidity.”

Local bond market started strong for the month of January as yields eased 20-30 basis points across the curve. The rally started from the benchmark FXTN 10-60 (8.569 yrs) reaching as low as 4.18% from 4.60% and spilled over towards the short end of the curve. GS yield movements have been taking its cue from US treasury movements.
