INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

The UnionBank Peso Short Term Fixed Income Portfolio is a peso-denominated money market fund designed to provide investors a higher-yielding liquid outlet for their short-term transactional funds. It seeks capital preservation with enhanced yields.

CLIENT SUITABILITY

A client profiling process should be performed prior to participating in the Fund to guide the prospective investor if the Fund is suited to his/her investment objectives and risk tolerance. Some of the key risks associated with this Fund are listed below:

- **Interest Rate Risk:** This is the possibility to experience losses due to changes in interest rates. The purchase and sale of a debt instrument may result in profit or loss because the value of a debt instrument changes inversely with prevailing interest rates.
- **Market/Price Risk:** This is the possibility to experience losses due to adverse changes in market prices of securities. It is the exposure to the uncertain market value of a portfolio due to price fluctuations.

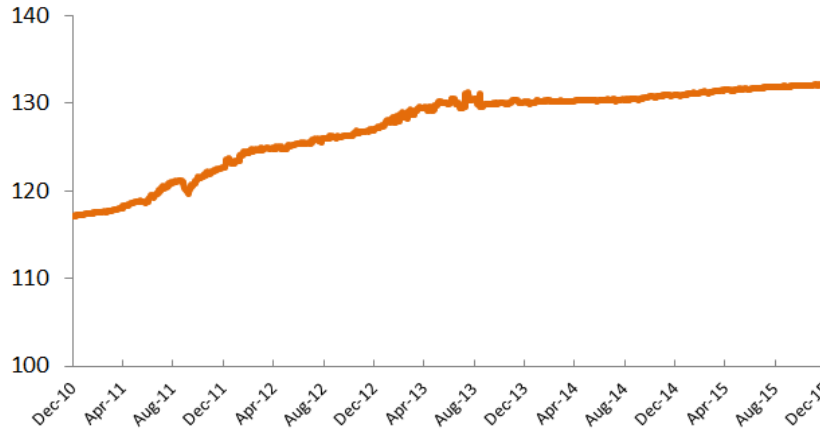

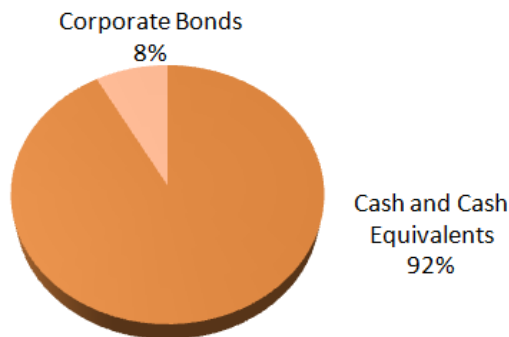
*Volatility measures the degree to which the Fund fluctuates vis-a-vis its average return over a period of time.

RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The fund has time deposits with City Savings Bank amounting to Php 61.04 Mn. This investment outlet was approved by the Trust Committee. Likewise, all related parties transactions are conducted on an arm's length basis.

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

The differences in Central Bank decisions will play a big part in the differences in valuations across the markets and different asset classes this coming 2016 as seen with the yield divergence among the US FED, the ECB, and the BOJ. There is still a lot of uncertainty despite the 25 basis point rate hike of the US FED. The pace and the number of future rate hikes remain uncertain. The IMF sees global growth to be weaker this 2016 at 3.1% as compared to 3.4% the previous year. Global trade and global productivity is seen to be weak this 2016; however global inflation will be muted due to low commodity prices and minimal wage pressure.

Emerging market bonds are seen to underperform as slowing growth in China and deteriorating global trade drag prices. On the local front, our view is that Philippine growth will remain above the 10 year average of 5.4% with private consumption, exports and investments providing the necessary supports.
