INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

The UnionBank Dividend Play Equity Portfolio is a peso-denominated fund that invests in dividend yielding equity securities listed in the Philippine Stock Exchange Index (PSEi). The portfolio has an equity-income/growth strategy that invests in stocks of well established companies that have a history of regular dividend payments and potential for capital appreciation. Income strategy counteracts the volatility of the portfolio.

CLIENT SUITABILITY

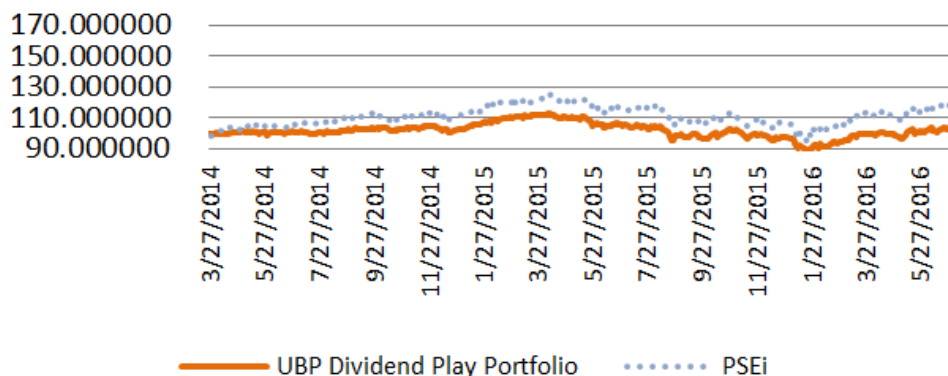

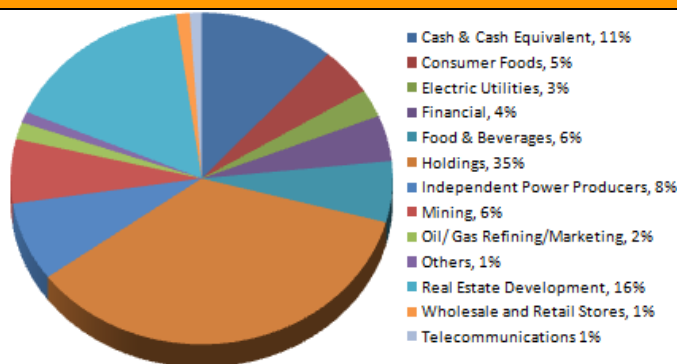
*Volatility measures the degree to which the Fund fluctuates vis-a-vis its average return over a period of time.

RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The fund has equity investments with Aboitiz Power (AP) and time deposits with City Savings Bank amounting to Php 6.17 Mn and Php 12.22 Mn respectively. These investment outlets were approved by the Trust Committee. Likewise, all related parties transactions are conducted on an arm's length basis.

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

The market shot up for June and closed 5.3% higher month-on-month, nearing the 8,000 levels once again despite the Brexit rocking financial markets globally. This marks another month of inflows buoyed the country as we outperformed our regional peers. With a seemingly better insulated economy from the UK's decision and a generally strong foundation, the Philippines became a target for passive flows and broad based buying as block orders and MOCs occurred throughout June. Another catalyst investors are hoping to bank on are the presumed reforms to be executed by Rodrigo Duterte, who has officially become the President of the Republic of the Philippines. If he can accomplish his wide array of reforms and policies, ranging from income tax reductions and junk food tax to revisiting REITs and improving infrastructure spending, we may see corporate earnings justify the expensive valuations of the market at this point.

The market continues to trade at resistance levels and may consolidate as the market waits for more catalysts to appear. We are maintaining our general strategy of staying nimble by concentrating on more liquid names as we rebalance given market conditions.
